



WINTER WEATHER NOTICES

Information for Weather-Related School Delays and Closings

The Village School uses a four-pronged approach for notifying families about weather-related delays/closings. The Village School does not always follow the SVSU delays and closings. We try to stay open as long as the conditions are safe. If you will be late or don't feel that you can get to school due to the conditions, we will understand and support your decision.

1. **Remind System** - We performed a **test of the Remind system today, November 15, 2022**. If you provided the school with your cell phone number, you should have received a text message from the Village School and/or a notification via the Remind App. **If you did not receive at least one of these (the text or the Remind notification), please contact info@vsnb.org or call 802-442-5955**. Please note: When you download the Remind app, push notifications are turned on and your text and email Remind messages are automatically disabled - so you do not receive duplicates. If you want to continue receiving text messages, please go into the Remind settings and change your Notification preferences.
2. **E-mail** - An email is sent to parents and guardians whose email addresses are on file with the school.
3. **VSNB Website** - We post an update on the school's website at www.vsnb.org.
4. **News Outlets** - We notify the Vermont and Albany news outlets through their alert system.

Dressing for Inclement Weather

Please be sure that your student is dressed appropriately for the weather. Dressing in layers is a good idea, as classrooms keep windows cracked year-round for ventilation. Keeping an extra set of clothing in their backpacks would be good in case they get wet.

- When the temperature is below freezing (32°F, 0°C), students should wear a winter coat. If they don't have one, please contact our nurse Kaitlyn Hewson (802-442- 5955 or khewson@vsnb.org).
- When it is snowing, we ask that students wear **snow pants, hats, gloves, and winter coats**.
